FAQs:

How many classes do I need to take for the minor?

A: Includes BUS 101, BLW 302 and only four additional three-credit courses selected from a diverse list of classes that have real world and practical applications. These choices may be selected based on your interests and career path.

I already have to take BLW 273 and 474 for my Accounting Major, will they count for the Business Law Minor?

A: Yes, the 2 courses can apply to both your Accounting Major & Business Law Minor degrees which leaves only 2 more courses for the minor.

How does BLW 302 help me?

A: BLW 302 will satisfy your multicultural requirement for graduation as well as being required by many majors in the College of Business; so it does not add more courses to your program of study.

Will this really help me prepare for law school?

A: In BLW 273, 302, and 474, most topics covered will provide you a strong foundation for many Law School classes.

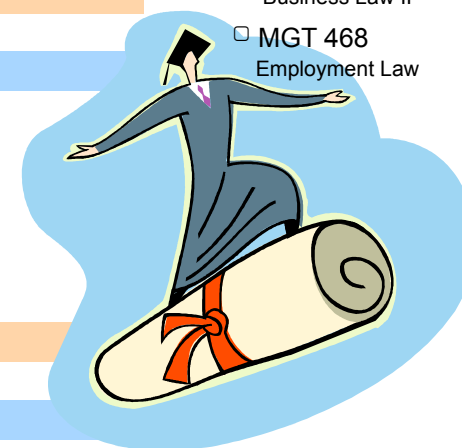
